Reminder

- **Full stops** should be used when you have finished talking about one subject and are moving on to another.
- **Questions marks** are used to show that a character or the writer is asking a question.
- **Exclamation marks** are used to show that a sentence should be said with great emotion. The exclamation mark makes the sentence more noticeable.



For each sentence shown below, decide whether it should end in a full stop, a question mark or an exclamation mark.

Anyaugo is a young girl who finds a chicken in her kitchen	
Anyaugo finds out that the chicken is actually a masquerade	
What should Anyaugo say to the chicken	
Can you speak Chickenese	
In the story, it is the New Yam festival in the morning	
The Wood Wit is such a horrible character	
Would you believe Anyaugo if she told you about the chicken	
Wood Wits can travel through anything made of wood
